# A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible. Hebrews 11:1-3

One hundred years ago, a group of Christians came together in Vineland to launch a Lutheran congregation. This was the "official" start to a church community that had begun years before in Lutheran homes, was dreamed about in other church buildings, and was shared with families around the community.

As they signed paperwork and celebrated a new beginning in 1924, I am certain they could not imagine what lay before them. Soon, an economic crash would devastate the country, world war would break out once again, and the families who signed the charter would watch as children of the congregation were sent directly into harm's way.

None of these events were on their minds when they began The Lutheran Church of the Redeemer. And yet even without seeing the events of the future clearly, their faith was clear in its vision.

With great faith, the people of Redeemer called a pastor and began helping people in need in the community. They expanded - both in congregation size and in mission: starting a preschool, senior housing, a food pantry and feeding ministry, and a counseling center. They resettled displaced persons coming to the United States; they supported missionaries sharing the good news around the world.

Bible studies, mission trips, Sunday School, Vacation Bible School. Camp, Diakonia, educating interns and supporting seminarians. Choirs, choir festivals, musicians of various instruments. Plays, skits, lectures, worship inside and outside and even in the parking lot! Countless weddings, funerals, baptisms, and confirmations. People who have shared in Holy Communion together, shared a cup of coffee together, and shared time in one another's lives. All of this - and so much more - has made Redeemer the place it is today.

Somehow I don't think the people of Redeemer in 1924 could have grasped all that lay before them. But their faith dared to dream of all they could not even hope for so long ago. They trusted in God. And because of their faith, we stand here now.

As we celebrate this milestone of our congregation, I pray our faith might be renewed. We also do not know what the future holds, but we stand together in proclaiming that future belongs to God. Praise God for such faith!

MISSION CHALLENGE - Pastor Moses will be joining us on Feb. 11. he will be discussing the progress made in the building of the university.


