

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER

Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. -1 Corinthians 1:10

In a recent study of 1st and 2nd Corinthians, I noticed how often Paul addresses the church in Corinth by the term "brothers and sisters." He calls them brothers and sisters when he is scolding them, encouraging them, asking them to work together, and commending them in their faith. You might recognize this language from parts of our liturgy today, when we continue to call one another brothers and sisters in Christ.

Such terms might seem odd – to refer to fellow church members and pew mates – sometimes even strangers! – as if they are family members. But this language is intentional. We do all belong to one family in God.

Like all families, church families are not always in agreement – contrary to what Paul might be hoping for as he writes to the Corinthians! And yet seeing one another as brothers and sisters does change our perspective.

There are many divisions in our community right now, from the way we vote, to the way we view social issues, to the way we want to worship. Before we accuse others of being wrong, before we feel slighted and angry, before we point fingers, let us take a moment to remember our brothers and sisters in Christ. What concerns are driving their decisions? How was care and love shown in their effort? How are they serving God in this place? How can I show love in my own response?

To help us work together, church Council has proposed we have breakfast together as a congregation once per month. We hope you will join us as we sit and eat with one another and share in holy time together.

Stained Glass Windows



Willet Stained Glass Studio designed the windows in the Sanctuary. The present, in symbolic form, events from the life of Christ. - The Annunciation, the Nativity, Christ's Baptism, The Call to Discipleship, The First Miracle, The Healing Miracles, The Prodigal Son, the Crucifixion, The Resurrection, The Great Commission, The Ascension and Pentecost. There are two chancel windows: the Gospel side; Wheat and Bread and the Epistle side,

Grapes and Wine; the two sacred elements of the Sacrament of Holy Communion.
