

PASTOR'S REPORT: Thanked and acknowledged the volunteers who dedicate their time and energy to the church.

National Youth Gathering - 3 youth and 3 adults will be attending. There will be a Fat Tuesday Pancake Dinner on Feb. 13th to raise funds. The Youth Gathering will be in New Orleans.

NEW BUSINESS: Annual Meeting will be held on January 21 with another Fellowship breakfast. There will be one service at 9:30 AM followed by a continental breakfast and the Annual Meeting.
