## A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER

My Christmas tree is packed away, along with all the special ornaments that I love to look at each season. The cookies are all gone – finally! The nativity scene is back in its secure storage spot, until I wonder where I left it next December. By my holiday accounting, I responded to all the cards and exchanged all the gifts that were expected of me.

This Christmas was a good one, and now life can go back to normal. Back to school and work. Back to getting up early and going to bed at a reasonable time. Back to eating toast instead of cookies for breakfast.

Normal is good. But I miss the twinkling lights. I miss my decorated tree – even if the dog kept trying to eat the ornaments. I miss knowing that “The Grinch” was on television once again – even if I never watched it. I miss the sugar rush of all the stuff we are only supposed to eat in moderation.

But a new season is upon us – not just in life, but at the church, too. The season of Epiphany might seem boring compared to Advent or Christmas, but I actually believe that it is the church’s anecdote to the post-Christmas blues.

Christmas culminates in the Messiah’s birth; Epiphany begins with the baby all grown up and being baptized. Christmas’s characters long for the coming Messiah; Epiphany introduces us to the Messiah in flesh and blood. Christmas describes what the Messiah will do; Epiphany shows him doing it. Christmas calls us to wake up and listen; Epiphany calls us to get up and be a disciple.

In other words, this is not the time to “check out” of church! The gospel stories we will hear in the next few weeks reveal exactly who Jesus is, and how the eternal light of the world still shines in the darkness.

Indeed, the God who is born at Christmas continues to show up – revealed in the ministry of Jesus, but also revealed in the ministry of all who still follow him. When we cook for Code Blue, when we shop for the food pantry, when we worship together, when we pray for those in need around the world, those twinkling lights of Christmas come alive in big, powerful ways!

Keep shining, my friends. Keep listening to the songs of the season. Keep bringing light out into the world.

## February Devotion by Deacon Federwitz

2 Corinthians 5:14-15 (NIV)-

*What's Love Got to Do with It?*

Have you ever felt like you were just going through the motions? Maybe you've had days where everything feels like a checklist—wake up, eat, work, sleep, repeat. It's easy to feel stuck in a cycle of living for ourselves, chasing what we want, and wondering if there's more to life. Deep down, we all long for purpose, for something bigger than just "me." But how do we find it? And what if we're looking in the wrong places?

The Apostle Paul gives us a powerful answer in 2 Corinthians 5:14-15. He reminds us that Christ's love is the ultimate motivator. Jesus didn't just live for Himself—He gave His life for us. His love is so overwhelming, so life-changing, that it compels us to stop living for ourselves and start living for Him. This isn't about rules or guilt; it's about being so captivated by His love that it changes everything. When we live for Jesus, we find the purpose and joy we've been searching for.

Paul wrote this letter to the church in Corinth, a city full of people chasing wealth, status, and personal gain. He wanted them to understand that Jesus' sacrifice wasn't just a historical event—it was a call to a new way of life. In a culture focused on self, Paul's message was radical: Christ's love changes us from the inside out, giving us a reason to live beyond ourselves.

The timeless truth here is that Christ's love transforms us. His death and resurrection aren't just facts; they're the foundation for a life of purpose. This Bible passage is prescriptive—it calls us to action. We're invited to live not for ourselves, but for the One who gave everything for us. This shift from self-centeredness to Christ-centeredness is as relevant today as it was in Paul's time.

What would it look like for you to live for Jesus today? Maybe it's choosing kindness when it's easier to be impatient. Maybe it's helping someone in need, even when it's inconvenient. Or maybe it's simply pausing to thank Him for His love and asking how you can share it with others. What's one way you can let Christ's love compel you this week? - this month?
