A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER

Sleep in Heavenly Peace....

The classic nativity scene we imagine on Christmas Eve is of a baby wrapped in a blanket, lying in a manger, sound asleep. In this image, Mom and Dad protectively watch over their child, with shepherds, animals, and even some wise men gathered into the scene. While we sing "Silent Night," the image suggests more noise than silence!

If you've ever been around a baby who is not a sound sleeper, then you understand how fragile the idea of peace and quiet is. We might tiptoe around an infant to make no noise; we might swaddle the newborn close to our hearts; we might ask a loved one to hold him tight to keep him asleep. Stillness, quiet, consistency are all thought to be part of peace.

What we often forget is how tough babies can be. Are there any lungs stronger than a crying baby?! Babies get jostled around in bouncers, passed around from person to person, are tortured by older siblings and family pets, and still come out smiling and laughing, while learning to sleep through the chaos.

As a new mom, I remember how powerful it was to have another mom tell me how resilient babies are In fact, it was a huge relief. No, I did not have to stay awake and watch over her while she slept, and I did not have to run into the room every time a noise was made. Even as a baby, my daughter had a strength inside of her that would grow as she got older.

The baby Jesus takes the idea of strength to the extreme. While we often focus on how fragile he is on Christmas Eve, the power of his life is already present. His birth is announced by angels, and he draws shepherds and wise men to his arrival. He is the Prince of Peace who brings the kingdom of heaven to earth. His coming is the good news for which the world has waited.

Like a newborn baby, some days our faith might also be perceived as fragile. There is so much noise, so much confusion, so much hate all around. But the Christmas story teaches us that this baby born in Bethlehem is God's strength wrapped in human flesh. He is love for all people; he is peace for a broken world. And we who follow him and proclaim him Savior find all of our strength in this tiny baby.
