Pastor Henry Voigt

In 1924 students from the Philadelphia Lutheran Theological Seminary led worship at the Moose Hall on Landis Avenue and then later in the Woman's Club on North 7th Street in Vineland. The original 40 members in attendance grew to the 56 members who became our Charter Members. Reverend Henry Voigt became our Pastor on June 5, 1925. Our first Baptism, Richard Werchan, was November, 1925.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER SUGDEN

March 15, 2020. I remember that Sunday. It was the last time we gathered in "full force" in the sanctuary for worship. It was before we wore masks, with all of us singing. I remember I was hesitant to "pass the peace" in the usual manner. I also remember being certain that we would return to "the usual manner" of doing things in a week or two.

March 2021. Obviously the past 12 months have been unprecedented; hopefully they will be confined to remembrances soon. I am also hopeful of the lessons we have learned as church in the past year. Here is what I hope to remember about Redeemer from this unusual year:

- 1. We are resilient. We showed up in heat and cold, rain and wind. We had people ask what they could do to help, and people who just started "doing." People wore masks and learned all the buttons and dials on their car radios. People took to new technologies they had never used before, such as Zoom and Facebook and YouTube. The complaints at discomfort were far outweighed by the shouts of gratitude. THANK YOU!
- 2. We are generous. People have continued to support the church with their gifts not just monetarily, but with genuine care and concern for both members of the congregation and the community at large. We saw a huge outpouring of support for everything from the food pantry to money for thermal underwear for the homeless. Church members offered to shop and deliver groceries, and simply to listen in order to drive away some of the loneliness. THANK YOU!
- 3. God is faithful. We have not always understood the how's, what's, and certainly not the why's of the past year, but God has always walked this journey with us. PRAISE BE TO GOD!

As we enter into a new March, our destination remains the same as last year's: the cross of Christ, and the hope that only comes on Easter morning. Thank you for being part of Redeemer's journey during this Lent to remember.
