A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER

When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them.

Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him.

-Luke 24:30-31a

There is a spot in the Manor House where plants seem to thrive. They love the sunshine that streams in through the big windows; they love the care they receive from their favorite gardener, Dorine. But they also seem to love having each other's company, as their leaves intertwine and stretch towards the church courtyard.

We are now in the Easter season at church. Up until Pentecost, we will be hearing stories of the risen Jesus, and the early work of the church. Some of these stories will even place themselves in very particular geographic locations: the upper room in Jerusalem, the road to Emmaus, the region of Galilee. We will be reminded that even though the story of Jesus is growing and the work of the disciples sends them to the ends of the earth, God's love is always rooted as well: in real places, and amongst real people.

We can add to the list the other places where we have recognized God. Maybe it is out in the woods, or on the beach. Maybe it is in the power of a thunderstorm, or in the still quiet of dawn. Perhaps our eyes are opened when we sing with others, or listen to beautiful music.

We can "find God" in any place. Indeed, there is no way we can limit God to any particular place or time. But as Christians, we return to worship in order to visit and revisit the places we have recognized God before. Just like the early disciples, our eyes are opened when we break bread and share food and fellowship together, and particularly when we share the meal of Holy Communion.

I hope Redeemer might be a spot where we are able to thrive in our faith. As we stretch and grow during this Easter season, may the true light find us – wherever we have been planted.




Watching Spring Unfold together with Young People. Some practices you can enjoy together could be:
