A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER

Have you noticed them yet, either in person or on our livestream? We have been blessed throughout the season of Epiphany with beautiful lights and stars to decorate the front of our sanctuary. Thanks to our Sunday School students and teachers for creating this powerful reminder of the light that continues to shine in our world!

It sounds strange, but I did not realize how dreary it was up front until we took down the Christmas trees and wreaths. Suddenly, the space seemed too empty – perhaps even a bit sad as I thought about Christmas being over, and wondered what would bring joy now that all of the bright decorations were put away. The tiny lights and handmade stars of Epiphany remind me that joy is not dependent on the calendar, but on where we look.

Epiphany is a season of light. We begin with the Wise Men following a star, and throughout the gospels of winter, we hear of Jesus' early days of ministry, and how he shines light into the world through preaching, teaching, healing, and time simply spent with people. The disciples are drawn to follow Jesus, and it does not take long before crowds of people are following wherever he goes.

I realize that the season of Epiphany will soon come to an end, as Ash Wednesday arrives and brings Lenten fasting and discipline. The decorative lights will come down, and I wonder if I will once again feel a bit sad at the loss of the beauty of holiday stars.





HISTORY LITTLE




