



Liberian Mission Project

At our annual meeting it was announced that our 100th Anniversary Mission Project will be to raise funds to help renovate a building in Liberia that will house a School of Agriculture and a School of Nursing. These schools will be part of the University of Liberia and will provide resources for families and the people of Liberia. Our goal is to raise \$15,000 for the purchase of building supplies.

We welcome any size gift for this special need. Watch on our bulletin board and in the Clippings on how this project progresses. We already have \$2,000 pledged to kick-off the campaign. It is hoped that we can reach our goal before spring. Below is a sample of how any size gift will be used.

\$100 some lumber
