A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER

We have been making our way through what is known as the "Bread of Life" series at worship during the month of August. In John's gospel, this is the way the story of the Feeding of the 5,000 is told: not just as a miraculous story of abundance, but a sign of what God looks like on Earth that requires some time for reflection.

It might seem tedious (and it certainly can seem tedious to the preacher some years!), but the way the gospel is spread out over 5 weeks forces us to eat slowly and truly consider what it means that Jesus feeds people with the Bread of Life. Yes, Jesus shows us, we are to be generous and use the blessings of this world to feed one another, just like the little boy's 5 loaves and 2 fish that feed 5,000 people. Yes, Jesus proves to us, we have enough of what we need to be satisfied. Yes, Jesus points out to us, true life is found in him.

But I also think we need to consider the actual feeding process itself. If you notice the way the story is told (check out John, Chapter 6!), it takes a while for the crowd to figure out how Jesus feeds them differently than any earthly power. This is not the Emperor throwing bread at them, or a soup that is thinned out with water to accommodate a growing crowd. No, Jesus offers the *best* food that satisfies *every* hunger. Everyone who comes to him will be filled, and will have eternal life.

I like to compare the bread of life Jesus offers to the typical food that fills our bellies by thinking about fast food versus slow food. I don't hate fast food. In fact, I find myself craving French fries WAY too often! But if we eat it all the time, we know it will make us sick. Slow food, on the other hand, is like gathering vegetables out of our garden, baking bread, and cooking with our loved ones to create a beautiful meal we sit down together to eat. The meal is not just the food itself, but the entire relationship with the people around us and the earth which provides.

Faith is an exercise in slow food. We can get by most of the time with the fast food the world offers cheaply and by doing our best to be a good person. But the food that truly satisfies our deepest hungers is a relationship with Jesus that sustains us our entire lives.

I pray we all might have the time to slow down and feast on God's abundance during this season of blessing.

Hymn of the Month - Living Lutheran August 2024

This month's hymn selection, Sent Forth By God's Blessing, is composed to ASH GROVE an upbeat Welsh Folk Tune (Ev. Luth. Worship, pg. 547).

The hymn was written by Omer Westendorf "during a time of great transition for the Catholic Church" in less than a year after the Sacrosanctum Concilium.

The Sacrosanctum Concilium, Second Vatican Council, Dec. 04, 1963, undertook" the reform and promotion of the liturgy" (Second Vatican Council, 12.04.1963) and: "transformed how congregations engaged with the church, increasing participation and unity" (LL. August, 2024).

Sent Forth By God's Blessing - read or sing and note the liturgical reference AND the word "By".
