A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER

"That's not the way I remember it!"

A few weeks ago I was sitting in my nephew's home in North Dakota with a large gathering of family. We were telling old family stories, which usually involve some level of humor—often at another person's expense.

There were farm stories, bad driving stories, even stories of wardrobe mistakes (it was the 80s, after all). I don't think there were any stories that were new to me, but some of them were definitely told in new ways, leading some people to object: "That's not the way I remember it!"

Have you ever said those words? Maybe the narrator took some liberties in making the story more exciting, or they really did have a different perspective on the action when it happened. Often, though, we remember stories the way they affect us—whether they are comforting, challenging, or simply confusing.

This summer's worship has included many stories that are familiar to our faith. We have heard The Good Samaritan, the tension between sisters Mary and Martha, and will hear many more old stories we probably learned back in Sunday School.

But despite how familiar the old stories are, I would guess there will be times when we say, "That's not the way I remember it!" Maybe we have forgotten some detail from the Bible, or we hear it differently because of where our life experiences have taken us.

Rather than assume we know everything about the story, I pray we might be challenged to hear something new in these ancient texts. Who are the people we are called to help? Can I see a stranger as a neighbor? Do the words of Jesus challenge me in my relationship with God and with other people?

This summer, we have the opportunity to hear God's Word all over again. May we open our ears so that God might open our hearts.




