A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER

Do you have a favorite Thanksgiving song? I realize you might think that's a typo, so I better explain myself. After all, you are fully aware of my tendency to listen to Christmas music all too soon...

As I find myself peering past Halloween into the time we simply call "The Holidays," I want to be sure we take time to give thanks. No, I'm not worried that turkeys and pumpkin pies get overlooked. And while I hope we all have opportunities to gather with our families, there is something even more important that our faith calls us to do: give thanks.

The Psalms – which are our earliest church songs - repeatedly give thanks to God. And in the New Testament, 1 Thessalonians encourages us to "give thanks in all circumstances" (1 Thess. 5:18). The liturgy of worship welcomes praise, as we even say "Thanks be to God" after hearing from the Bible.

Personally, though, it is the hymns of this time of year that focus me most sharply on giving thanks. "Praise and Thanksgiving" and "Now Thank We All Our God" have been sung by multiple generations, while we sing "Give thanks with a grateful heart" with a more modern sound. When I hear "For the Beauty of the Earth," it is easy to make the connection with God's incredible gift of this world and its changing seasons.

And then there are the times maybe we do not expect to give thanks. I have attended many funerals where we have sung together "How Great Thou Art." In that hymn, we praise God for the beauty of creation – and the beauty of salvation. Yes, even through tears and the pain of grief, we sing praise together as God's people.

I do not know what your Thanksgiving holiday will look like this year. But I pray that each and every one of us is able to sing our favorite Thanksgiving song. In times that are easy and times that are challenging; in times of joy and times of grief; in all of the seasons God has created for us all, let us praise God.

The distribution of 3,000 disaster relief kits assembled during the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering was completed in mid-September, given to the underserved households in Louisiana.

New Orleans, that regularly experiences damaging events is accustomed to people "overpromising and underdelivering"

This year's Youth Gathering of 16,000 participants was partnered with the Louisiana Just Recovery Network – "Kids in the orange shirts . . . who show up and do what they said they'd do, joyfully!"

The ELCA Conference of Bishops has issued a statement on the need to speak the truth, "in part – We know that the power of truth is greater than the power of deceit"

"We refuse to accept the ongoing normalization of lies and deceit. We recommit ourselves to speaking the truth and pointing to the one who is truth"
